Ms. Dillon announced a health insurance presentation to be held with commissioners on Monday, May 15th at 5:00 p.m. She stated information would be included in weekly packet.

WATER LINE – JUNIOR NOFFEL

Ms. Dillon stated Mr. Noffel has purchased property that was operated in past as concrete company, but has been unoccupied for several years. She stated a water meter was set about 175' onto the property when this property was in use. She stated Public Works Director Hubert Maynard wants to set the meter where it should be located at the street. She stated the city is trying to stay off private property and when occasions arise to correct these situations, Mr. Maynard is attempting to do this.
